



## Youth meet to discuss school budget cuts

On Wednesday, March 17, Woodland Joint Unified School District officials are hosting an event with the Woodland Coalition for Youth, Yolo Family Resource Center and Woodland Youth Development Network to discuss the impact of the statewide budget crisis on programs affecting youth in Woodland.

"Our youth voices must be heard in these tough economic times," states Gary Callahan, director of Secondary Education for the School District. "We need their input and ideas."

This meeting will be the fifth in a series of seven meetings Woodland Joint Unified School District officials are holding with the community, staff and students. Callahan expects recommendations to be developed and presented to the Superintendent and Board of Trustees by April.

"When you look at the school districts around us, we have been very proactive at managing our resources and responding to this unprecedented crisis. Our community has been fantastic at rallying around our students and supporting their programs for years. We are hopeful that the students will be able to provide us with valuable information that we can utilize as part of our planning efforts."
